Zuckerberg has had a terrible week after outage hits platforms. And it's only Tuesday

FACEBOOK'S WORLDWIDE CRASH exposed the risks of relying on its social networking products, bolstering European regulators' drive to contain its reach just as a whistleblower's testimony threatens to attract more unwanted scrutiny at home.

While Europe awoke to find Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp and Messenger services back online, the global Monday black-out quickly led to criticism. The European Union's antitrust chief and digital czar, Margrethe Vestager, said the Facebook failure would focus minds on the company's dominance.

It's always important that people have alternatives and choices. This is why we work on keeping digital markets fair and contestable, Vestager said. An outage as we have seen shows that it's never good to rely only on a few big players, whoever they are.

The networking problem that brought down services used by more than 2.75 billion people couldn't have come at a worse time. After a US television



interview on Sunday, whistleblower Frances Haugen will appear before a Senate subcommittee on Tuesday and will tell lawmakers what she calls the "frightening truth" about Facebook. Haugen's accusations that the company prioritizes profit over user safety were still making headlines as Facebook services were down.

The revelations prompted US Representative Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez to highlight the risks faced by countries that rely on the services for privacy.

Facebook already faces numerous antitrust and privacy investigations across Europe as well as intense scrutiny of even small deals, such as its planned takeover of a customer-service software provider. The company was fined 225 million euros

(\$261 million) last month over WhatsApp data failings and faces separate antitrust probes from the European Commission and German competition watchdog Bundeskartellamt.

EU lawmakers will in coming months vote on new laws that would curb the ability of powerful internet platforms such as Facebook to expand into new services. The services disruption showed the "serious consequences" of dependency on one company for key communication channels, and that Facebook should never have been allowed to buy Instagram and WhatsApp, said Rasmus Andresen, a German Green member of the European Parliament.

Everyone in the European Union as well as in the U.S. must

realise now at the latest that we need strong regulations against such monopolies, Andresen said in a statement. "We need close transatlantic cooperation."

JIAH KHAN SUICIDE

Court allows CBI plea to adjourn trial for three weeks


IN the suicide abatement case of actor Jiah Khan, filed against actor Suraj Pancholi, special court on Tuesday allowed a plea by CBI demanding that the trial in the case be adjourned for three weeks as the agency wants to decide on an appeal against an order by the court rejecting its plea for further investigation. The court said that it was granting time to the CBI "as a last chance". Last month, the CBI's plea seeking a forensic probe into the dupatta used by Khan to hang herself and the Blackberry handset used by her, was rejected by the special court. The court had then said that the case was registered against Khan's then boyfriend Suraj Pancholi in 2013 and an effective trial was awaited since eight years.

On Tuesday, Pancholi's lawyer Prashant Patil opposed the CBI's plea for adjournment stating that the case needs to be expedited for hearing.

He also said that Pancholi is an actor and his work has been hampered with the matter being pending for so many years. The court said the CBI plea was rejected on September 16 and it had been given sufficient time to decide on the further course of action. The CBI prosecutor said the agency will file an appeal in the Bombay High Court shortly. Khan's mother, Rabia, the complainant in the case, also said that she is going to file an appeal.

"Considering submission of both the sides, this court is of the considered opinion that it would be proper to keep on hold this trial further next three weeks as prosecution and the complainant want to challenge the order of this court," the court said adding that if the CBI does not produce the copy of the writ petition challenging the order, an appropriate order will be passed against the prosecution".

The hearing is adjourned for October 26.

Man held for sexually assaulting 15-yr-old boy

AS 55-YEAR-OLD real estate agent was arrested on Monday for allegedly sexually assaulting a 15-year-old boy for the last one year in Mumbai.

The police said the accused had secretly made a video of the act, which he used to mentally torture and rape the boy repeatedly. However last week, when the minor refused to act as per his demands, the man forwarded the video to his friends. It subsequently went viral on social media.

A case was registered on

Police said the accused, 55, had been assaulting the victim since last year and had secretly made a video of the act, which he used to further torture the boy

Monday under sections 377 (unnatural offences) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code and the Protection of Children under Sexual Offences Act, 2012.

The police said the boy was first sexually assaulted last

September. "The accused, who stays in the same area as the victim, had called him to his house. He threatened and forced the minor to remove his clothes, after which he clicked a photo of his private parts," said an officer. The real estate agent, threatening to post the pictures on social media, kept calling the boy to his house and sexually assaulted him, said police.

"He also secretly made a video of the act on his cellphone. The agent called him to his house and sexually assaulted him repeatedly till the last week of September (2021)," the officer said.

"When the minor refused,

the agent would threaten that he would post the video on social media or show it to his friends. To stop him from doing so, the minor agreed to his demands."

However, last week, when the accused called him again to his house, the boy refused to go. "The accused called him thrice but he did not go. In anger, the agent sent the video to the boy's friends," said the officer.

The video subsequently went viral and it reached minor on his phone. The 15-year-old boy then narrated his ordeal to his parents.

"They came to the police station on Monday afternoon, after which a case was registered. We

immediately dispatched a team to the boy's locality and brought the accused to the police station," said Senior Inspector Sriram Koregaonkar. After primary interrogation, the accused, who stays with his wife and a daughter, was arrested.

The police have recovered the video and seized the accused's cellphone. "We will soon send the cellphone for forensic examination," said an investigator. The real estate agent was produced in court on Tuesday and remained in police custody. "We are checking whether he has sexually assaulted any other person using similar operandi," said Koregaonkar.

17 days after arrest, man convicted and sentenced in sexual harassment case

IN ONE of the shortest trials in the city, a man was convicted and sentenced to three years in jail, 17 days after he was arrested for sexually harassing a woman in a public garden in south Mumbai.

An FIR was registered on September 18 at LG Marg police station against Rajkumar Tandel after he flashed his private parts at a woman in a public garden in south Mumbai.

The woman was sitting on a bench and attending an online class when she noticed the man flashing his private parts at her. She ran towards the exit and two others, who were out on an

evening walk, asked her what was wrong. They then caught the accused and informed the police.

The same day, as the FIR was registered, the police led by investigating officer Pallavi Jadhav recorded the statements of the two passersby who were independent witnesses to the incident. The victim's statement was also recorded.

Assistant public prosecutor MS Chaudhari said that after a swift investigation, the police filed the chargesheet within a week. The accused pleaded not guilty and charges under sexual harassment were framed against him by the court. The court then summoned the witnesses.

The victim's deposition was completed, where she identified the accused present in court. Chaudhari said that four witnesses were examined—including the victim, the two passersby and the investigating officer. The two independent witnesses deposed before the court that they had seen the accused trying to zip his pants after the incident and identified him to be the person who was caught that day, Chaudhari said.

The prosecution submitted before the court that Tandel was convicted of a similar offence in 2018 and sentenced to three years in jail under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act. In that in-

cident, which occurred in 2015, Tandel had similarly flashed at a minor waiting for her school bus. The girl informed her mother, who visited the spot the next day and he was caught. The offence was registered at Azad Maidan police station.

Based on this evidence, metropolitan magistrate Yashashree Marulkar found the accused guilty on charges including section 354 (assault or use of criminal force to a woman intending to outrage modesty), section 354 (1) (physical contact and advances involving unwelcome and explicit sexual overtures) and section 354(1)(g) (stalking) of the IPC along with a fine of Rs 1,000.

New cable-stayed bridges to replace 2 British era ROB

TWO BRITISH-era road over bridges (ROBs)—Ray Road in Byculla and Tilak Road in Dadar—will be demolished and new cable-stayed three-lane bridges will replace them.

The Maharashtra Rail Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (MRIDCL), which will carry out the execution of the construction work, started the tender procedure earlier this month. The actual reconstruction is expected to start in November.

While MRIDCL has taken up execution of reconstruction work, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) will bear the expenses for the construction. The two ROB—Ray Road across Ray Road railway station connecting Byculla to Nagpada, and Tilak Nagar ROB near Dadar railway station—provide crucial east-west connectivity passing over the railway tracks.

According to officials, the 385-meter Ray Road ROB and 600-meter Tilak Nagar ROB are the busiest bridges in central Mumbai. Before starting the work,

authorities will close one arm of the bridges and later start work on the second arm. The bridges will not be completely closed at one go. Once one side/arm of the new bridge is complete, then the old bridge will be raised.

Officials said they are coordinating with BMC as well as traffic police to ensure smooth flow of traffic and no trouble for motorists. While Rs 175 crore has been approved for the Ray Road ROB, Rs 375 crore has been approved for the Tilak Road bridge.

"Tenders have been floated for Ray Road and Tilak Road ROB and the estimated cost for the two bridges is Rs 118.56 crore and Rs 216 crore, respectively, in the bidding process. While the completion period of Ray Road bridge is 300 days, for the other it is 640 days. The bridges will be wide and the size of the spans will be modern and long to ensure that there are less foundations and underground utilities won't be disturbed," said an official, adding that the work will start as soon as the bidding process is completed in a month's time.

'No imminent third wave', HC asks govt to consider offline BMC meetings

OBSERVING that prevailing pandemic situation in the city does not indicate any imminent "third wave", the Bombay High Court on Tuesday directed the Maharashtra government to consider within five days why the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) cannot be allowed to conduct its standing committee meetings through the physical mode.

The court, while hearing a PIL by two BJP councillors, directed the chairman of the Shiv Sena-led BMC's standing committee to allow petitioners to physically attend the panel meeting being conducted on Tuesday afternoon.

A division bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice Makarand S Kamik was hearing a PIL by BJP's Vinod Mishra and Makarand Narvekar, challenging the notice issued by BMC on October 1 pertaining to convening of the meeting of the panel through virtual mode on Tuesday.

Advocates Anil Singh and Jeev Ganani, appearing for the petitioners, challenged the notice issued by BMC on October 1 pertaining to convening of the meeting of the panel through virtual mode on Tuesday.

Short of space, BMC invites suggestions on housing people displaced by projects

OWING TO a lack of space and shortage of homes to compensate various Project-Affected Persons (PAP), the BMC is seeking suggestions from the general public, landowners and developers for making tenements available for the demographic.

"To complete the vital public projects in a time-bound manner and to rehabilitate families affected in vital public purpose projects in the vicinity, MCGM (Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai) desires to invite suggestions from General public, Private Landowners, Developers and concerned stakeholders for making available PAP tenements," stated the note by the civic body.

At present, BMC can only construct 2,000 units on its civic-owned plots. In 2019, BMC had invited private landowners

and developers to construct PAP tenements on their plots but received a poor response.

Last year, BMC again invited tenders for construction of 24,000 PAP tenements. However, the bidders quoted exorbitant premium in addition to the land and construction TDIs (Transferable Development Right). The state government, earlier this year, approved the payment of premium to the bidders. After scrutinising the bids, BMC approved the construction of 4,000 PAP tenements, which is in process.

Currently, BMC requires 36,229 units to house PAP families, which is likely to increase to 50,000 families in the next couple of years.

steps accordingly," read the note. PAPs are those groups of people who stand to lose their housing or business units due to development or infrastructure projects like road and nullah widening, bridge construction, water or sewerage line extension or other infrastructure initiatives. Availability of vacant land and its acquisition is the key factor for successful implementation of the plan of the said projects, stated BMC.

As per the policy framed by the state government, authorised/protected structures on lands need for public projects are allotted PAP tenements. According to the said policy, eligible residential and non-residential structure holders are allotted PAP tenements free-of-cost by the civic body. Civic officials said, "Considering the dearth of residential PAP tenements, it is becoming difficult for the civic body to rehabilitate the PAPs,

which is adversely affecting and delaying the implementation and completion of important Public Welfare projects, thereby resulting in escalation of Project cost."

In addition, facing dearth of space, BMC has also proposed to give cash compensation to such people instead of flat/housing units. The civic body has proposed to give cash based on market rates of probable flats to tenants on the civic-owned land who are hit by projects, and also to affected slum dwellers. The proposal will be extended to PAPs categorised as extremely vital, which will be decided by the municipal commissioner.
