Day 1: Sena & NCP leaders visit temples across state

ASPLACES OF worship in the state reopened on Thursday, several Shiv Sena and NCP leaders visited temples in Mumbai, Pune and other parts of Maharashtra.

The visits to temples assume significance in the backdrop of the BJP's attack on the MVA government over not opening the places of worship. Places of worship were closed in the state after the second wave of Covid-19 started in March this year. Last year, after the first wave subsided, places of religious worship were reopened from Diwali Pooja on November 16.

On Thursday, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, his wife Rashmi and son Aaditya, the Tourism Minister, visited Mumbai's oldest prayer places, Congress leaders visited the nine-day Navratri.

Thackeray said he prayed to Mumbai to eradicate the coronavirus permanently. It is the responsibility of all of us to follow Covid protocols at the places of worship," said the CM. He further said that trustees and priests at all places of worship should ensure that devotees follow discipline while offering prayers, that the shrine premises are cleaned and sanitised frequently and social distancing is followed.

NCP's Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar and Irrigation Minister Jayant Patil offered prayers at Siddhivinayak Temple in Mumbai and Dagdusheth Halwai Ganapati Temple in Pune. NCP Minister Nawab Malik and Congress Minister Aslam Sheikh visited the Mahim dargah and Haji Ali dargah in the city. While Shiv Sena and NCP leaders visited temples, Congress leaders seemed to have stayed away.

PLACES OF WORSHIP REOPEN Online appointments, Covid rules greet devotees in Mumbai

PLACES OF worship in Mumbai reopened on Thursday after over six months due to the second wave of Covid-19.

The first day of reopening did not see much crowd as many popular temples like Mumbai and Siddhivinayak only allowed devotees who had booked online appointments for darshan.

Over 2,500 devotees visited Mumbai's oldest temple in the Kalbadevi. "We are allowing 250 devotees in an hour, all with prior booking. At the entrance, we are checking their temperature and oxygen level. Nobody is allowed inside without a mask. The temple will remain open from 7 am to 6 pm. We will ensure that Covid-19 protocol is followed properly," said Hemant Jadhav from the Mumbai temple.

However, since it was also the first day of Navratri festival, many people arrived at the temple without taking online appointments. "Many devotees arrived without appointment. We explained to them about the online appointment procedure and asked them to return," Jadhav said.

Early morning, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, with wife Rashmi and son Aaditya also visited Mumbai's oldest temple.

At Siddhivinayak temple in Prabhadevi, devotees were allowed darshan with online appointment and QR code. The Siddhivinayak trust also allowed 250 devotees per hour to maintain social distancing norms.

On October 1, the BMC had issued guidelines for reopening of places of worship. The civic body has said that all religious places should reopen at 50 per cent capacity. Mosques also opened for worship on Thursday. Shaob Khatri, trustee and chairperson of Jama Masjid of Bombay Trust, said that only 50 per cent of the total people will be allowed for Friday prayer.

"On first day, there was a crowd. The trust has made arrangements by following Covid-19 protocol. Since all mosques have opened, people have dispersed to offer prayers," he added.

Khatri further said, "The challenge will be on Juma day (Friday prayer), when many people will visit mosques. We have decided to have multiple Friday congregational prayers so that social distancing is maintained. We have also increased our number of volunteers so that they can guide people in following Covid-19 protocol."

While churches in Mumbai also reopened, trusts said they are not making arrangements for regular Sunday masses. "From Sunday, regular masses will start... while two masses will be held in the morning, one will be organised in the evening. It is expected that all Covid-19 norms are followed with the help of volunteers. Similar instructions have been issued by the archdiocese of Mumbai for the church and St. George's Pimenta, associated with St John the Evangelist Church in Marol.

On March 9, on the basis of the note left behind by Delkar and after recording Abhinav's statement, a case was registered against BJP leader Pratul Patel, District Magistrate (DM) Sandeep Singh, superintendent of police (SP) Sharad Dardade, deputy DM Aurwa Sharma, Sub-divisional officer Manasvini Jain, police inspector Mahan Patel, DNH law secretary Rohit Yadav, BJP leader Pankaj Chaudhary and a man called Dilip Patel (Talathi) at Marine Drive police station in Mumbai. The case is under investigation by the Mumbai police.

Govt announces special drive to support Centre's 100-crore vaccination goal

STATE HEALTH Minister Rajesh Tope on Thursday announced a special vaccination drive - Mission Kowach Kudat - from October 8 to 14 to support the Centre's target of 100 crore vaccinations. "We have one crore vaccine doses and there are still 3.2 crore people in the state who have not yet been administered the first jab. Priority should now be given to the first dose," said Tope.

The minister held a video conference on Thursday with authorities across each district and directed them to mobilise people to get vaccinated. As part of the special drive, said Tope, more than 15 lakh vaccine doses need to be administered for the next six days.

He cited the instance of Pune and Pimpri-Chinchwad, where a non-stop vaccination round was conducted for 75 hours recently to reach out to the maximum number of people, including people with special needs.

"There are districts which have to expedite vaccination and... I urge the administration in districts and municipal corporations to reach out to religious leaders to encourage more participation in the vaccination drive," he said.

The overall target is to vaccinate 91.5 crore beneficiaries, of whom at least 62 per cent have been administered the first vaccine dose. Maharashtra holds the record for the highest number of vaccine doses administered in one day - 15.3 lakh doses on September 8.

21 stray dogs found dead in Ratnagiri city, FIR lodged

Mumbai: The Ratnagiri city police on Thursday registered a case over the suspected killing of 21 stray dogs, which were found dead in the city between Wednesday night and Thursday morning. The police said the total number of dogs had increased. Vine Chaudhary, senior police inspector of Ratnagiri city police station, confirmed the development. He told The Indian Express, "A person who works for animal rights lodged an FIR early on Thursday. Poisoning is suspected. Further probe is on." The dogs were found dead in different areas like Aranga Mandir area and ICICI Road, ENS.
