CBI director seeks dismissal of PIL by ex-ACP challenging his appointment

CENTRAL BUREAU of Investigation (CBI) director Subodh Kumar Jaiswal recently submitted an affidavit in the Bombay High Court in response to a public interest litigation (PIL) filed by former assistant commissioner of police (ACP) Rajendra Trivedi, challenging his appointment as the chief of the central agency. Jaiswal claimed that the PIL was filed out of sheer vendetta and vengeance, and with a personal grudge against him.

Jaiswal, who is a former Maharashtra director general of police (DGP), said Trivedi held a "personal grudge" against him over his postings and also due to a "default report" that he had sent based on which a disciplinary inquiry was initiated against

the former ACP by the state Home Department. Jaiswal was responding to a PIL challenging his appointment on the grounds that he was neither eligible nor had the requisite experience to occupy the top post.

A division bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice Makarand S Karnik had, on June 9, issued notice to Jaiswal and the Union Home Department, seeking their response to the plea argued through advocates S B Talekar and Madhavi Ayyappan.

The plea filed by Trivedi claimed that Jaiswal's appointment was in contravention of the Delhi Police Establishment Act. It sought direction to seek call records and proceedings of the committee that had cleared Jaiswal's name as a candidate in May 2021.

The plea stated that Jaiswal, before being appointed as the CBI

director, was never part of any agency which investigated anti-corruption cases. Advocate Talekar pointed out an order by the magistrate court, which had issued proceedings against Jaiswal on a defamation complaint in 2012, and said the same was not placed before the committee which had appointed Jaiswal.

Trivedi further referred to observations by the Supreme Court and a trial court on Jaiswal's conduct during probe of the fake and counterfeit stamp paper scam, known as the Telgi scam. The plea said the same raised questions over Jaiswal's integrity and, therefore, pending the hearing on the plea, he should be restrained from officiating as the CBI director.

Jaiswal, in his affidavit, said that while the central government will respond to the factual position on record about his ap-

pointment, he was responding to specific allegations made by the petitioner.

Denying Trivedi's allegations, Jaiswal, who was head of the special investigation team which investigated the Telgi scam, said the competent authority of the CBI had found the SIT had taken "appropriate legal action" in the probe.

Jaiswal said the present plea was "not an isolated incident of attempting to initiate malicious proceedings" against him, and claimed that Trivedi has been "on a witch-hunt to malign his reputation" with the "sole intention" of involving him in uncalculated litigations. He pointed out that Trivedi had previously approached the Maharashtra government and the Bombay High Court, challenging his appointment as the Maharashtra DGP.

Jaiswal also questioned the maintainability of the plea stat-

ing that Trivedi, before his retirement, had a grievance against him about his postings. Trivedi's subordinate officers had allegedly sent a default report against him to Jaiswal, who, after examining the same, sent it across to the government for a departmental inquiry against the former ACP, the respondent said. The inquiry was initiated by the government in 2019, he added.

Jaiswal said the PIL was an "abuse of process of law to harass him and tarnish his image and reputation" and such a petition filed to "settle grudge or enmity is liable to be dismissed". Trivedi filed a rejoinder to Jaiswal's affidavit and denied having any personal grudge against the CBI chief. He stated that a "calculated attempt was being made to mislead (the) court by twisting facts."

The court is likely to hear the plea next on July 28.

FIRST YEAR JUNIOR COLLEGE ADMISSION

Students who fail to confirm admission to get more chances

IN WHAT may come as a relief to candidates aspiring for First Year Junior College (FYJC) admissions through the centralised online process, if students fail to confirm admission after having been allotted a seat in their first preference colleges, they would be barred only from the next round and not from the entire process.

Till last year, these students would have been left out of the system and would have to wait for a special round to be held after the entire admission process was over.

As per the regular practice, a candidate will be out of the admission system under three conditions - failing to confirm admission if the allotted seat was in first preferred college, cancelling the confirmed admission and college rejecting the admis-

sion because the candidate was not able to present required documents in given time.

"A candidate has to confirm admission, if the allotted seat is in a college which is first in his/her order of preference of colleges. The rule continues, but the punishment is reduced. As per the old practice, they were immediately thrown out of the system. But now they will be out of system only for the immediate next round. Whereas their application will be reconsidered later," said an official from the office of Deputy Director of Education which conducts the online FYJC admissions process. The official said this would allow the candidates more chances to take admission to colleges of their choice.

The Part-2 of the form, in which candidates have to fill the college of their choices in the order of preference, will be open from July 22. Whereas the Common Admission

Process (CAP) rounds wherein seats are allotted will begin only after CBSE results are out and those students have completed the process of application. The SSC result was declared on June 17, whereas the ICSE result was out on Sunday. This year, there will be a total of 3,69,995 seats available for First Year Junior College (FYJC) in Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), after Panvel (Rural), Bhiwandi and Vasai, in the online admissions process.

HC gets nine more judges, total strength now 62

NEARLY FIVE months since the Supreme Court collegium made its recommendations, nine lawyers on Tuesday took oath as 'additional judges' of the Bombay High Court, taking the High Court's working strength to 62.

The High Court was functioning at the strength of 53 judges after Justice V G Bisht retired on Monday. Now, it will function with 44 permanent judges and 18 additional judges. However, the sanctioned strength of the court, which is the second largest in the country after the Allahabad High Court, is 94. With three more judges set to retire by the first week of November, the strength is likely to fall below 60 if no new names are recommended by the Supreme Court collegium.

The central government on Saturday had cleared nine of the 10 names of lawyers, appointing them as additional judges.

In a notification, the government had appointed advocates Kishore Chandrakant Sant, Valmiki Menezes S A, Kamal Rashmi Khata, Sharmila Uttamrao Deshmukh, Arun Ramnath Pednekar, Sandeep Vishnupant Mame, Gauri Vinod Godse, Rajesh Shantaram Patil and Arif Saleh Doctor.

Chief Justice Dipankar Datta administered oath to the nine lawyers on Monday. The only recommended name that is yet to be cleared by the government is that of senior advocate Somasekar Sundaresan, a securities and regulatory expert.

Seeking quashing of FIR for 'hunting, purchasing wild animals', bird rescuer moves HC

A BIRD rescuer from Mumbai, Pradeep D'souza, recently approached the Bombay High Court seeking to quash an FIR lodged against him by the Maharashtra Forest Department for allegedly hunting and purchasing wild animals. The FIR was filed for alleged violation of the Wildlife (Protection) Act (WPA) in 2021.

In his plea, D'Souza (47), said he was the most sought-after bird rescuer in Mumbai who rescues and rehabilitates trapped, sick and injured birds. He said even Forest Department officials seek his help for rehabilitation of birds as the government has inadequate infrastructure for the same.

D'Souza, in a petition filed through advocate Amrita Nair, submitted that on March 14, 2020, he had written a letter to the Office of Conservator of Forest, Thane Forest Division, and had given a list of the birds rescued by him according to the guidelines provided in the WPA. He added that despite repeated efforts to seek help from forest officials to rehabilitate the injured birds, his requests were unanswered, leaving him with no option but to keep the birds till they were fit to be released.

In October 2021, D'Souza's house was raided by the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau and the Forest Department. As many as 110 kites, 43 parrots, eight bats, seven barn owls, two night herons and a sea gull were seized. D'Souza said the birds, at the time of seizure, were unfit to survive in the wild.

The petitioner was booked under Sections 9 (prohibition of hunting), 48A (restrictions on transportation of wild life) and 51 (penalties) of the WPA, which are punishable with jail term of up to three years.

D'Souza, who was arrested on October 5, 2021, availed bail from a magistrate court four days later.

As per his plea, the magistrate court noted that D'Souza was providing care and shelter to the injured birds.

A division bench of Justice Nitin Jamdar and Justice N R Borkar could not hear the plea on Monday due to paucity of time and adjourned the same to August 2.

HC to Shirdi trust: Pay dues for cleanliness to civic body

THE AURANGABAD bench of Bombay High Court has set aside a June 2020 decision of the ad hoc committee of Shri Saibaba Sansthan Trust which stopped paying the pre-decided monthly fee of Rs 42.51 lakh to the municipal corporation for cleanliness and sanitation of the town after the entry of devotees was suspended due to Covid restrictions. It also asked the Trust to pay the balance amount payable under the government decisions within four weeks.

Passing the judgment in a group of petitions seeking that the decision of the ad hoc committee be set aside, a division bench of Justice Ramesh D Dhanuka and Justice Sanjay G Mehra held that the state government is empowered to modify, annul, reverse or remit such a decision to the Sansthan Trust for reconsideration and can stay the execution of any such decision or order of the executive officer or the committee.

The petitioners, including the Shirdi Nagar panchayat, had also sought direction to release the amount payable to the municipal council as per the April 2018 government resolution (GR) and provisions of the Shri Saibaba Sansthan Trust (Shirdi) Act, 2004.

The petitioners claimed the Trust's decision to be 'arbitrary' and contrary to the established procedure, which it was bound to abide by for five years.

On January 19, 2018, the scrutiny committee of the Trust resolved to release Rs 30 lakh per month for five years for utilisation of the civic body to

carry out work of cleanliness and sanitation at Shirdi. In November 2018, the government increased the amount payable to Rs 42.51 lakh per month for five years.

Senior advocate V D Hon said the civic body started receiving the funds from Sansthan Trust and carried out cleanliness and sanitation activities but the release of funds every month was stopped in May 2020.

The petitioners submitted photographs to show that due to non-payment of funds, the civic body was not maintaining cleanliness in Shirdi town and representations to the panel to release funds were refused, causing health issues to the residents.

The lawyer for the ad hoc committee argued that the decision was taken due to complaints from the public alleging misappropriation of funds by the civic body.

The counsel said that petitioners had an alternative remedy available to challenge the decision before the state government and therefore, the pleas were not maintainable before the high court.

After perusing submissions, the bench said, "Local residents continue to reside in the area even during the pandemic. The petitioner (nagar panchayat), had to continue the contract for providing its services for cleanliness and sanitation even during the pandemic. The taxes collected by the petitioner are used for public services. The municipal council was required to carry out this obligation including the obligation to maintain cleanliness and sanitation in Shirdi town."

The court quashed and set aside the June 2020 decision of the Trust.
