Not much has changed at SGNP 25 years after HC ordered removal of encroachment

THIS SATURDAY, the Bombay High Court order to clear the Sanjay Gandhi National Park of encroachment will complete 25 years but not much has changed on the ground.

The petition was filed by Bombay Environment Action Group (BEAG) for removal of encroachments and stopping quarrying in forest lands. Though the final order came much later in 2003, the state forest department has barely made any progress on removing encroachment. Hutments have increased manifold and the latest aerial view shows that nearly 100 acres of forest land has been encroached upon.

The SGNP is spread over 103 sq km and extends from Thane to Goregaon in the east-west side, and Borivali to Dahisar on the north-south side. These slums are largely on the park's periphery.

Environmentalist Deb Goenka, who was earlier with BEAG, told *The Indian Express*: "The problem was that demolition was not effectively done. The boundary walls were not complete. Many of those who were evicted from Chandiwadi in 2003 and came back to the slums in the park. I think to 10 per cent of the slums have gone."

also frequent. Besides encroachment, there are some tribal hamlets that have to be shifted. When the HC judgment was delivered, the SGNP was headed by an officer of deputy conservator rank DCF Anand Bhartiwale, who for nearly 12 years removed hutments but failed to do so as encroachment continues. Now, SGNP is either headed by an officer of chief conservator or conservator rank. The present field director is Indian Forest Officer G. Mallikarjun and he has two deputy conservators to assist him. The SGNP had also got many more guards to assist them in demolition.

In the initial years, demolition squads faced intense opposition from slum dwellers. They allegedly burnt their houses down and blamed the forest department for molesting their women or for the theft of their property. Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe (prevention of atrocities) Act, 1989.

Alongwith the order to remove encroachments, the High Court also passed an order to take 100 acres of quarry land at Dahisar which was done two groups of slum dwellers were playing cards in the forested area and were seen to be lying around. Cases of leopard straying in housing societies were

in the entire world. More recently, a forested patch of Aarey was transferred to the forest department. But slum removal has not happened. In the 1997 judgment, a slum rehabilitation scheme was to be implemented. The first phase took place but none of the slum dwellers came forward in phase two.

He said that the forest department is now constructing protection flux (also known as forest canker) along the boundary which will keep a watch on fresh encroachments. Former IAS officer Praveen Pardehi, who was the forest secretary and later the additional chief secretary in the CM's office, said, "Two forest secretary 5 days after the judgment. We completed most of the compound walls to prevent fresh encroachment. We removed encroachments to some extent. We also had a plan to rehabilitate 2,000 families and this was approved by the government. This is the only way to take the SGNP out of its member-a lot of slum dwellers were shifted to Chandiwadi."

But retired Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (wildlife) Nitin Kakodkar has a different view. He said, "I had a position of light and shadow. It was not clear that the SGNP is a natural forest. This is the main reason for the failure. Prior

to 1995, slums were protected, hence, eligible. The ones after that were unprotected. However later, the government extended the protection to slums constructed till 2001."

Environmentalist U. Stalin of NGO Vanshik gave a different solution. He said, "More than 25,000 hutments have come up since the judgment. Slums will never go. I had suggested that instead of giving houses, remove those areas from the park and add new areas which are unencroached. I also sent a list of areas. But the problem has worsened. The forest department has been ineffective in stopping new encroachments."

There have been incidents of leopard straying to or within Borivali West, across the creek, and also to Kholinagar crosses by crossing the railway line. On many occasions, leopards come to human settlements to kill stray dogs. NP leader Vidya Chavan who led the fight for slum dwellers said, "I was on the media and I took up the cause of the slum dwellers. I used to travel by train and I met some women whose houses were demolished by the forest department and took up their case. Once I travelled myself to my home in Vile Parle for the demolition spot at Laxmi Nagar. My intention was to save houses of poor."

After SC order, SEC tells local bodies to continue poll process

EVEN AS THE MVA government has said that the SC order on ward delimitation of local bodies is ambiguous, the state election commissioner (SEC) on Friday asked the Zilla Parishads, Panchayat Samitis, Municipal Council, and Nagar Panchayats to continue the poll process from where it was stopped in March.

Samitis to check the draft ward boundaries at the SEC and six Zilla Parishad did so on Friday. Besides, it asked the 208 municipal council and eight Nagar Panchayats to seek suggestions and objections on the draft ward boundaries till May 14.

Reports were submitted to the SEC by the nodal officers. So, the work of finalising the ward boundaries is in the final stages and is being carried out at the SEC level, said an official.

THE BRIHANNUMBA Municipal Corporation (BMC) has started uploading details on ongoing desilting of nullahs on its website. Besides checking the work progress, residents can also file a complaint about uncleaned nullahs. The system went online Friday.

The BMC has faced criticism over delay in cleaning nullahs. The BMC had demanded that the BPF had demanded that the special squad be formed to keep track of the progress in cleaning nullahs. This year, the BMC has set target of removing 4,67 lakh tonnes silt from nullahs.

Deputy Municipal Commissioner (Infrastructure) Ulhas Mahale said this will bring transparency in real-time updates of desilting work on the website and on their mobile phones. By entering the name of the nullah and with information, the progress of the work can be seen. The website will also show details like quantity removed, photos and videos," said Mahale on Friday while addressing a press conference.

According to the infrastructure department there are five rivers and 309 major nullahs across Mumbai. While major nullahs have a total length of 290 km, there are 508 minor nullahs totaling 605 km. Apart from these, the city also has 2,004-km long small size drains and gutters.

This year, the BMC approved nullah cleaning proposals worth Rs 62 crore.

So far, the BMC has completed desilting work in 45 per cent nullahs and the remaining work will be completed by May 15, officials said.

Man refusing to vacate flat for redevelopment to pay Rs 5 lakh to housing society

THE BOMBAY High Court recently imposed a cost of Rs 5 lakh on a member of a housing society who was not vacating his flat, which is in a dilapidated building, even after the society appointed a developer to demolish the building and construct a new one in its place.

The developer informed the HC that the society had on November 24, 2018, passed an unanimous resolution for redevelopment and appointed the petitioner as the builder. On May 3, 2021, the BMC also issued a notice to the society asking that the building be vacated for demolition as it was "absolutely in a ruinous state." An agreement between the society and the developer was signed on June 29, 2021.

Maintaining that a single person cannot take the housing society to ransom, the HC directed the member to vacate the flat within two weeks, failing which, the court would take forcible possession of the house to handover it to the developer or the society (imposed a compensatory cost of Rs 5 lakh on the member to repair the society within 10 days).

This January too, the BMC issued a notice to the society asking members to vacate the building. Following this, 10 members wrote in consent to vacate the premises on or before March 2. "The respondent member however did not cooperate. Barring the consent of the respondent, senior advocate Brendra Said said on behalf of the developer.

HC dismisses two pleas challenging multi-member ward system for civic bodies

THE BOMBAY High Court on Friday rejected two pleas challenging the state government decision of October last year which reintroduced a multi-member ward system for all municipal councils and corporations having BMC in the existing single-member ward system.

corporators from every ward "disturbs good governance".

The petitioners added that ruling Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress by coming together will be able to field candidates in each electoral ward. "It is only under the garb of collective representation, the present government aims to get political mileage... and multi-member wards are a self-serving move that the government is trying to do to the BMCs as well?" the plea said.

However, Advocate General Ashutosh Kumbhar on behalf of the government opposed the pleas and claimed them to be non-maintainable and that the state's decision was as per law. The State Election Commission (SEC) also opposed the plea.

As per the government decision, there will be a three-member ward system in municipal corporations and a two-member ward system in municipal councils. In other words, municipalities will be demarcated together to create a three- and two-member ward system in corporations and councils respectively. There will be change in the number of wards in corporations that would be bunched together only for the purpose of the election.
