

# Kejriwal to stay in jail; SC seeks ED reply by Apr 24

Judicial custody until April 23; SC to hear plea in week starting April 29

THE SUPREME COURT issued notice Monday to the Enforcement Directorate on Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's plea challenging his arrest in the Delhi excise policy case and fixed hearing in the matter in the week commencing April 29.

The bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta gave ED time until April 24 to file its response after which Kejriwal can file a rejoinder by April 26. Also Monday, a Delhi court extended the judicial custody of Kejriwal until April 23 — he was arrested by the ED in the excise policy case on March 21 and sent to judicial custody on April 1.

Kejriwal approached the Supreme Court after the Delhi High Court dismissed his plea against his arrest on April 9, observing that the ED was in "possession of enough material" which showed that he was Kejriwal to stay in jail, SC notice to ED on his plea against arrest "actively involved in the formulation" of the excise policy.

Senior Advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, appearing for Kejriwal in the Supreme Court Monday, questioned the timing of his arrest, maintaining that "the object of arresting on March 21... post the Model Code of Conduct" was "to disable me from campaigning".

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the ED, objected to the submission.

Singhvi prayed for an earlier date but the bench said the date it had given was the earliest it could.

Singhvi said he wanted to

show some facts "to shock the conscience of the court", that there have been "some selective leaks" and requested the bench to hear the matter Friday.

Justice Khanna said, "We will give you a short date, but (it's) not possible on the date suggested by you."

Singhvi said, "This is an unusual matter and not because he is a Chief Minister. There are two documents, ECIR and FIR, and there are eight chargesheets between the CBI and ED. This petitioner is not named."

"The story starts September 2022. He was arrested on March 21, 2024. Between that time, there are 15 statements, nine by one person, six by others. All 15 statements do not state the above," he said.

The bench asked him to reserve his arguments for the next date of hearing and went on to issue notice.

Appealing against the High Court's April 9 ruling, Kejriwal questioned the timing of his "illegal" arrest under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), saying it was "in the middle of the election cycle and especially after the declaration

of the schedule of General Elections 2024."

Stating that his arrest was "obviously motivated by extraneous considerations", he said it "was made solely relying on subsequent, contradictory, and highly belated statements of co-accused who have now turned approvers". These statements and material were in the ED's possession for the last nine months but the arrest was made just ahead of Lok Sabha elections, he said in his plea.

Naming some of the co-accused, Kejriwal said the statements of C Arvind, Magunta Reddy and Sarath Reddy, who claim to have met him, don't suggest that he had done any act of commission or omission within the scope of Section 3 of the PMLA. The statements by two others — Butchibabu and Raghav Magunta — are entirely hearsay, he said, adding that they had not even met him.

In his petition, Kejriwal said the High Court failed to appreciate that statements under Section 164 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) are not held to be the gospel truth, and can always be

doubted by the courts. Section 164 can never be used as substantive evidence of the truth of the facts but may be used for contradictions and corroboration of a witness who made it, he said.

The petition stated that the High Court also failed to appreciate that the statement of the co-accused-turned approver cannot be the starting point for ascertaining the guilt of the accused. Moreover, the court, he said, failed to appreciate the procedure adopted by the ED in procuring such statements by coercion, on the inducement of bail and exoneration, and hence cannot ex facie be relied upon to ascertain his guilt.

Underlining the urgency of the Supreme Court's intervention, he said "over and above the issue of illegal curtailment of liberty, the... arrest also constitutes an unprecedented assault on the tenets of democracy, free and fair elections and federalism, both of which form significant constituents of the Basic Structure of the Constitution".

"The ED has allowed its process to be used and misused by vested interests as an instrument of oppression to not only invade the liberty of the political opponents in the midst of general elections 2024 of such vested interests but also to tarnish their reputation and self-esteem. Such lawlessness cannot be allowed to be perpetrated under any circumstances," Kejriwal said in his plea.

Saying that the arrest "bears serious, irreversible ramifications for the future of electoral democracy in India", he said if he "is not released forthwith to participate in the upcoming elections, it will establish a precedence in law for ruling parties to arrest heads of political opposition on flimsy and vexatious charges before elections, thereby eroding the core principles of our Constitution".

# Notice to CBI on Kavitha's bail plea in excise scam

New Delhi, April 15

A DELHI COURT on Monday issued notice to the CBI on BRS leader K Kavitha's bail application in a corruption case linked to the alleged Delhi excise scam. Special judge for CBI and ED cases Kaveri Baweja, who sent Kavitha to custody till April 23, directed the agency to file its reply by April 22.

The CBI had arrested the Telangana MLC and daughter of former CM K Chandrashekar Rao from Tihar jail, where she was lodged after her arrest by the ED in a money laundering case stemming from the alleged scam. The CBI is probing alleged corruption in the formulation and execution of the AAP government's excise policy, while the ED is investigating the money laundering aspect. In her bail application in the corruption case, Kavitha said she was a 'star campaigner' for her party in the general elections. She sought an interim bail while her regular bail application was pending.

"The investigating agencies are well aware that there is no substance in the allegation of the petitioner's involvement in the alleged scam. The intention behind the investigation against the petitioner is not to ascertain her involvement in the alleged scam, since it is painfully clear that none exists. The political masterminds are well aware that if the petitioner can be connected to the alleged scam, it will bring her, and by logical implication, her father, the erstwhile CM of Telangana, into disrepute," the application said.

# BJP looks at Tirunelveli to expand footprint in TN

WITH ITS MIX of prominent castes such as OBC Nadars and Thevars (including Maravars), a substantial presence of SCs/STs, and its large Muslim population, the Tirunelveli Lok Sabha constituency is a testing ground for the cross-caste consolidation the BJP is building to expand its footprint in Tamil Nadu. What is helping this along in Tirunelveli is the BJP's choice of candidate, Nainar Nagendran, a popular leader who commands a vote base running across caste and party loyalties.

Nagendran says the BJP's brief to him is to make Tirunelveli another Kanniyakumari, among the first Lok Sabha seats to be won in Tamil Nadu by the party and considered one of

its strongest constituencies.

While originally from Nagercoil, three-time MLA and hotelier Nagendran has been a significant figure in Tirunelveli now for over two decades. A Maravar Thevar, he had a swift rise in the AIADMK after joining it in the late 1980s; the AIADMK top echelon had many Thevars, including J Jayalalitha's confidante VK Sasikala, at the time.

After he won his first Assembly election from the Tirunelveli Assembly seat in 2001, Nagendran was made a minister by Jayalalitha, and given portfolios such as electricity, industries and transport. Following Jayalalitha's death in 2016, Nagendran shifted to the BJP, claiming "lack of direction" in the AIADMK. In the 2021 Assembly elections, he was re-elected from Tirunelveli on a BJP ticket, in an

alliance with AIADMK. One of the four BJP candidates elected to the House, he was appointed party's legislature party leader.

Amidst the rise of K Annamalai in the Tamil Nadu BJP, including his appointment as the state party chief, Nagendran has held his own. Unlike the brash IPS officer-turned-politician, who doesn't mind treading on toes, Nagendran has come to perfect a politics that mixes a vision for regional development with cultural nationalism — which is seen as just the gap the BJP needs to fill in its Mission Tamil Nadu.

While Union home minister Amit Shah campaigned for Nagendran in the 2021 Assembly election, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has addressed two rallies in Tirunelveli, including one on Monday.

# CAA: A Nehru from Pak awaits tryst with citizenship

NO CONCRETE ROADS, no piped water supply, no sewage system and no concrete houses — a step inside Adarsh Nagar Hindu Migrants relief camp in north Delhi feels like a leap back in time. And yet, for the nearly 250 Hindu refugee families from Pakistan occupying this land for over a decade, the camp symbolises hope — of Indian citizenship under the recently notified Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA), 2019.

On April 5, nearly four weeks after the BJP government at the Centre notified the Act on March 11, 180 of the camp's 1,500 CAAs. At Delhi camp, a Nehru from Pak awaits tryst with citizenship refugees applied for citizenship under CAA at a small office in their local school. Under the Act, undocumented non-Muslim migrants — Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis and Christians — from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan who came to India before December 31, 2014, are eligible for Indian citizenship.

One such application was submitted by the camp's spokesman, Nehru Lal, 48. He was asked for a copy of his passport, visa application and the residential permit he got when he left for India in 2013. Named after independent India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, he says, "It was quite common for people in my locality in Sindh (in Pakistan) to name children after popular Indian politicians."

Dressed in a white pathani suit, he said he fled from Pakistan's Sindh due to increasing violence against minorities. Today, his 65-member family, including his wife, eight of his 10 children, six brothers and their respective families, reside at the camp, located at the Delhi Jal Board Maidan. "We survive on the salaries of my sons, who work at a mobile phone repair shop. While six of my daughters got married in Delhi after we moved here, two

are settled in Sindh," he says. Sitting on a *khaat* (cot) in his makeshift house, Nehru recalls his first trip to India with his family. "We arrived here on a tourist visa along with nearly 500 others on a pilgrimage to Haridwar in 2013 and decided to stay back. We were issued a 25-day visa in 2013, which we have been getting renewed online every two-three months. We are not required to specify a reason for seeking an extension, but we have to submit an affidavit each time stating that we want to renew our visa," he says.

Given his refugee status, he cannot move around in India without permission or buy property. "All those restrictions will go away after I get citizenship. Delhi has nothing to offer a farmer like me. I would like to buy land in Uttar Pradesh or Uttarakhand to grow wheat and sugarcane — just like I did in Sindh," he says, adding he has been saving money.

Besides Adarsh Nagar, there are 4 more camps in Delhi for Hindu refugees from Pakistan — in Rohini, Shahbad Dairy and 2 in Majnu Ka Tila. Nehru says, "Only around 1,000 people in these 5 camps are eligible for citizenship under CAA."

Sisters Rajnandini, 16, and Jamma, 15, who came to India in 2013 with their parents, also applied for Indian citizenship at the camp's school on April 5. "Sindh was our home, but India will be our new home soon. Our father used to grow onions in his field in Pakistan. He works at a mobile phone repair shop here, while our mother makes mattresses," says Jamma, adding her sister and she are two of three girls from Sindh's Bauri community who attend the local school. While the girls agree that India has given them the freedom to go to school, Jamma complains about the conditions in the camp. "It needs to be developed. When it rains, the area gets submerged."

However, Pradhan Nehru does not have much hope when it comes to improvement in the camp's conditions.
